How to Plant Blueberry Bushes Dig holes about 20 inches deep and 18 inches wide... Space bushes 4-5 feet apart in a row, with at least 8 feet between rows. Set the bush in the hole with its roots spread out. Apply fertilizer one month after planting, not at the time of planting.

Blueberry plants need full sun: Once you have your location selected, make sure that the location will get full sun, at least $\frac{3}{4}$ of the day. Blueberries will tolerate partial shade, especially late in the day. Blueberries will grow in higher pH, but to achieve highest production, you will need to amend the soil around the plants. This can be done easily over time.

Blueberries can be grown from both hard and softwood cuttings. Hardwood cuttings - Harvest hardwood cuttings in late winter, after the bush has gone dormant. Select a healthy looking stem that's one year old (last year's new growth) and cut it into 5 inch (13 cm.) lengths. Stick the cuttings in growing medium and keep them warm and moist.

Standard blueberry bushes can reach heights of 6 feet (1.8 meters), which is awfully tall for a container plant. Top Hat and Northsky are two common varieties that grow to only 18 inches (.5 meters). Plant your blueberry bush in a container no smaller than 2 gallons, preferably bigger.

Blueberries like a higher acid soil. For this reason, you should be using a high acid fertilizer, especially in an area where you have had to amend the soil in order to lower the pH enough to grow your blueberries. When looking for a high acid blueberry bush fertilizer, look for fertilizers that contain ammonium sulfate or sulfur-coated urea.

It's a good idea to mulch your blueberry bushes annually to prevent weeds and to keep the soil moist. Blueberry roots grow close to the surface, so it is not advisable to till or cultivate the soil for weed control.

If your pH is higher you'll be best to plant blueberries in a container. Container cultivation is often best if your soil is a heavy clay too. If growing blueberries in garden soil, add plenty of bulky, acidic organic matter such as pine needles, leafmould or composted conifer clippings.

Rabbiteye blueberries are a non-climacteric fruit and should be allowed to ripen on the bush. The fruit of the Tifblue variety will ripen over a 4 to 6 week period. A normal season can extend from late May to late July. Don't pick the berries until they are

In commercial production of blueberries, the species with small, pea-size berries growing on low-level bushes are known as "lowbush blueberries" (synonymous with "wild"), while the species with larger berries growing on taller cultivated bushes are known as "highbush blueberries". Canada is the leading producer of lowbush blueberries, while the United States produces some 40% of the world supply of highbush blueberries.
